Guest Speaker

In the absence of our guest speaker, Yale Jones spoke about the Guatemala Water and Sanitation Project that Taos Milagro Rotary will be doing as a Partner Grant with Nueva Guatemala this year. The project will provide handwashing and bathroom stations for 5 schools. Service will be provided to 2,127 students and teachers at these schools and training on the use of the stations will be included.

To date, Yale has secured \$12,000.00 pledge from the District, \$3000.00 from the Santa Fe Club and \$5,220.00 in pledges from Santa Fe Club members. In addition, the Albuquerque Del Sol and Carlsbad Clubs are on board to pledge funds.

Yale said that last year local club members donated their \$1,000.00 Paul Harris donations (a total of \$8,000.00) for the water projects that were on-going. He made a request that we do so again and had forms to take pledges so that they could be submitted once the project receives final approval. Pledges in any amount will be appreciated for this worthwhile project. Please see Yale Jones for a form for your Paul Harris Pledge.

Two visits will be made to Guatemala by Taos Milagro Rotary members. In October, one team will go to present the funds. In April, another team will go for the Ribbon Cutting / Inauguration.

Bruce said that any new member to the Taos Milagro Rotary, not yet in Paul Harris that makes a \$500.00 will have those 500 points matched by the club.
